## Focusing On The Future Where All Railroads Come Together

RSSI, in our continuing efforts to make our annual exhibitions a learning experience for every attendee, customer and supplier, once again has expanded our horizon. The theme of this year's show "Focusing On The Future - Chicago 2003 - Where All Railroads Come Together" truly represents what RSSI has set out to accomplish - to further demonstrate the importance of the signal and communication contribution to safe and timely railroad and rail transit operation.

The 2003 Exhibition will be held July 9th and 10th at The Navy Pier in Chicago. It will again follow the "all-together" format that has been utilized for the past two years. The new format has been wholeheartedly endorsed by the signal and communication community as evidenced by the fact that Chicago 2003 is being co-hosted by communication and signal leaders from all the major railroads.

Several of the 2003 co-hosts have expressed a desire to have a greater participation by communication exhibitors. As a result, RSSI is actively pursuing new communication supplier members and encouraging present communication suppliers members who have not participated as an exhibitor in the past to respond to these requests.

Commuter rail and rail transit attendance has increased considerably since the new "all-together" format was initiated and most certainly the Chicago 2003 Exhibition will see a significant increase of signal and communication attendees from these properties. Registrations have already been received from commuter rail and rail transit people from Chicago and the surrounding area.

## **RSSI Expands Registration**

With the increasing attendance at recent C&S Exhibitions we have taken steps to better accommodate the railroad, rail transit and government attendees who register in advance. An <u>Advance</u> <u>Registration Pick Up and Information Desk</u> for *railroad, transit and government registrants only* will be located in the East Tower, Bronze Level of the Hyatt Regency Chicago. This facility will be open 8:00 AM - 5:00 PM on Tuesday, July 8th (only) allowing those railroad, transit and government attendees who have registered in advance to pick up their registration packets during meeting breaks without having to travel to the Navy Pier Convention Center.

All On-Site and all Supplier Registration will be located near the exhibit hall entrance in the Navy Pier Convention Center. Registration Desk hours of operation are as follows:

## BOOTH RENTAL/REGISTRATION ON THE "FAST TRACK"

RSSI member companies are reserving exhibit space for Chicago 2003 at a brisk pace. By early-March over 264 booth spaces have been reserved by 101 different suppliers. Based on the current floorplan, there are approximately 48 booths remaining.

Advance registrations are also being received at a faster pace than in the past, especially in the commuter rail and rail transit area. Early indications are that Chicago 2003 will improve on the 1.078 to 1.0 supplier to customer ratio established in Louisville in 2002.

Wouldn't it be great to have more customer attendees than supplier attendees? This could very well be the year.

### **RPI Becomes RSI**

The Railway Progress Institute became the Railway Supply Institute on January 1, 2003 following their consolidation with the Railway Supply Association. RSI Chairman George Kline will address the RSSI membership at the Annual Membership Meeting on July 8th in Chicago where he will provide more information on the consolidation.

## 2003 RSSI Scholarship Program



The RSSI Scholarship Program continues to be a success averaging more than 50 applicants annually. Each year scholarships are awarded to qualified applicants to assist with the ever-increasing costs of obtaining a higher education. The scholarships are for \$2,000 per year for up to four years.

Information and applications for the 2003 Scholarship Contest were mailed to all RSSI member Voting Representatives in early January. The Voting Representative is responsible for distribution of information within their company.

The deadline for receipt of applications for the 2003 contest is May 1, 2003. The two winners will be announced and notified by late July and all the applicants will receive notification. The Scholarship recipients will be featured on the RSSI website (www.rssi.org) and in the next RSSI newsletter.

### Where Are They Now?

For the past twelve years RSSI has awarded scholarships to eligible participants from RSSI member companies. D'Arcie Anderson was awarded the scholarship in 1996 - here is where she is today:

### D'Arcie (Anderson) Chitwood:

The RSSI scholarship helped fund my education at Liberty University in Lynchburg, Virginia. The RSSI scholarship was much appreciated; it greatly reduced the financial burden of schooling at a private Christian university. Upon graduation in January, 2000, I worked in a minor emergency clinic at home (San Angelo, Texas) while preparing applications for medical school. While I was waiting for acceptance to medical school, I earned my Master's in Public Health from Texas A&M University System Health Science Center School of Rural Public Health. My concentration was in Policy and Management. While earning my Master's, I learned the foundational importance of health promotion in addition to health treatments. Health promotion and risk behavior prevention efforts are DEFINITELY more economical than the end result of health care treatments. After graduating with honor's from A&M in 2002, I worked as a research assistant for the Rural Healthy People 2010 project—a document to be used nationally as a blueprint for reducing urban vs. rural health disparities. It was also during this summer before my enrollment into Kirksville College of Osteopathic Medicine that I married Chad Jeremy Chitwood (August 3, 2002).

Currently, I am a newlywed and a first year medical school student at KCOM. Again, thank you so much for helping fund my education. With God's help, I hope to accomplish even greater things.


