COVID-19 Brings 60 Years of History to an End

On June 13, 1966, the Railway Signal and Communications Suppliers Association was incorporated in the State of New York combining two separate predecessor associations for railway signal suppliers and railway communications suppliers. On January 11, 1972, a document was filed and approved changing the name of the association to Railway Systems Suppliers, Inc. (RSSI)



For fifty-nine consecutive years RSSI and its predecessor associations held an annual exhibition where members of the associations could exhibit their products to their rail customers. This fifty-nineyear history came to an end on March 31, 2020 when the RSSI Board of Directors voted to cancel the 2020 60th Annual RSSI C&S Exhibition due to the Coronavirus.

There was never a question in the minds of the board members that this was the right decision. The safety of the exhibitors, customers and other attendees to the exhibition was and always will be the priority.

All booth, registration and hotel room payments were 100% refunded within sixty days of the cancellation.

In 2021 we are preparing to begin a new legacy as we look forward to joining AREMA, REMSA and RSI for Railway Interchange 2021 in Indianapolis, IN September 26-29.

The 2021 event will look different as we are taking all the necessary steps to keep the safety of our attendees first and foremost while ensuring that the experience will still be rewarding and productive for customers, exhibitors and invited guests.

Railway Interchange to Return in 2021 with Enhanced Safety Measures



Its been too long. The rail suppliers are anxious to exhibit their products and services face to face with their rail customers. Everyone is wanting to see old friends and renew relationships with their business associates and customers within our industry.

Railway Interchange 2021 may be the opportunity to finally move past the disruptions of the Coronavirus and return to a state of normalcy. The key as always is safety. Can we bring a large group of individuals together for an exhibition, for industry related meetings and for social events and ensure that the venues offer a safe environment?

The associations that host Railway Interchange, the decorators and the Indianapolis Convention Center are taking the steps necessary to ensure that the exhibit halls, food and beverage offerings, meeting rooms, and social gatherings will meet and exceed all local, state and federal guidelines for protection against the Coronavirus.

RI 2021 is still a year away and a lot of positive things, including a better understanding of how the virus is transmitted and vaccines, will be developed. RSSI worked with the convention center and our decorator FERN to develop a floorplan with one-way aisles and exhibition booths that allow for social distancing. Sanitizing stations will be located throughout the exhibit hall and at entrances and exits. Headcounts will be conducted so that no area exceeds a safe number of individuals. Signage will be in place to maintain a safe flow of traffic. Plexiglass and other means of separation will be installed at registration and other locations where necessary.

We are taking all reasonable measures to make sure that RI 2021 offers a safe environment while still serving the purpose of providing a meaningful experience for the exhibitors and customers.

Mark September 26-29, 2021 on your calendars and join RSSI, AREMA, REMSA, RSI and the North American Rail Engineering Industry in Indianapolis for a successful return to a new normalcy.



Enthusiastic Opening for RI2021 Booth Sales!

On Wednesday November 4, 2020 RSSI member booth sales went on sale for the 2021 Railway Interchange Conference and Exhibition which will be held at the Indianapolis Convention Center September 26 to 29, 2021.

With the COVID pandemic situation still a concern there was uncertainty as to whether our member companies would be ready to commit to a face to face exhibition although the event was still 10 months away.

We are happy to report that the member companies of RSSI are ready to exhibit their products and services to their customers in an exhibition style forum. As of the close of day on November 6th 115 companies had reserved over \$650,000 in booth space for RI 2021. We are on a similar booth reservation pace as in past years.

In April 2020 RSSI had to cancel the C&S Exhibition due to the pandemic. 100% of all booth payments were refunded

to our exhibitors by June 1, 2020. In order to avoid having to refund booth payments in 2021 the RSSI Board of Directors decided that no booth deposits or payments will be due until April 1, 2021. Hopefully by the end of the first quarter of 2021 we will have a better understanding of the status of the September event.

Indiana is now operating in stage 5 response to the pandemic and the Indianapolis Convention Center has held several functions with as many as 7000 attendees. All indications are that the 2021 Railway Interchange Conference and Exhibition will be a well-attended event by both suppliers and customers.

Thanks to all our member companies and new companies who purchased booths in the RSSI halls for 2021. It is our goal to make your experience successful and enjoyable.

RSSI Purpose and Goals

RSSI exists to hold an annual exhibition where its member companies can exhibit their products and services. Our goal is simple, to organize an event where the maximum number of customers can spend the maximum amount of time with as many exhibitors as possible.

RSSI is not a lobbying association and we are not an educational or technical association. We are an exhibition association.

In the even numbered years when it is an RSSI only event primarily involving the communications, signal, and IT sectors of our industry it is easier to achieve our goal.

In the odd numbered years when we join with AREMA, REMSA and RSI it requires more organization and planning. The distractions created by having a large event with different areas of focus can often lead to less customer/supplier face time.

RSSI holds social events outside of exhibit hours with food and beverages where customers and suppliers can interact in a relaxed atmosphere.

These events have become popular with our customers and members and include interactive games and sports zones with multiple HDTVs showing all the current sporting events.

RSSI has the lowest annual dues and operating costs of all the Rail Industry Engineering Trade Associations. Fourteen percent of the annual dues are used to support the various associations and organizations that perform lobbying work for our industry and to sponsor the organizations that produce the technical manuals and educational seminars. Five percent goes to our scholarship program and the remainder is used for the association operating expenses.

RSSI undergoes an annual audit conducted by CPA firms specializing in non-profit associations. The different auditing firms we have used over the years are always impressed by the internal controls RSSI has in place to make certain that the General Accepted Accounting Practices are followed and by our record keeping.

One hundred percent of our operating costs are funded through our dues and income from the annual exhibition.



2021 Exhibition Floorplan

RSSI has designed the booth layout of the floorplan for RI 2021 to accommodate the pandemic social distancing rules currently in place. As shown the aisles have been replaced with pavilions to maximize booth exposure. Booths located in hall G below the RSSI information booth (1800f) may have to be relocated to Hall C if additional social distancing space is needed.

2020 Scholarship Winners

RSSI is pleased to announce the recipients of the 2020 scholarship awards.

The James R. Higginbottom scholarship award winner is Amasha Jayaratne. Amasha's father Adisha is employed by Siemens, Inc. in East Brunswick, NJ.

The W. Ed Rowland Memorial Scholarship has been awarded to Samuel Steen. Samuel's father Robert works for Princeton Consultants, Inc. in Rocky Hill, NJ.

We received 40 applications for the 2020 scholarship awards. The scholarships are available to all children, step-children, grandchildren and step-grandchildren of the employees of RSSI member companies in good standing. The scholarships are \$12,000 each payable in \$1500 increments each semester for four years. A recipient must remain enrolled in an accredited college or university and maintain a 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale. The applications are judged by three independent judges in ten categories including: academics, leadership, goals, essay and letters of recommendation.

The judges scores are tabulated and the overall top scoring applicants are reviewed and approved by the RSSI Scholarship Committee.

Amasha is a graduate of East Brunswick High School in East Brunswick, NJ.


